FY2025 Application and Eligibility Requirements

[Background and Scholarship Program Objectives]

Dr. Mitsuzo Shida (1935-2018) was a graduate of the Faculty of Engineering at Kyoto University. After continuing his research and obtaining his Ph.D. in the United States, he remained in the U.S. where he achieved great success in the field of polymer science. It was his wish to create the Shida Scholarship Program to provide students and researchers enrolled in the Faculty of Engineering and Graduate School of Engineering at Kyoto University, with a scholarship opportunity to support their advanced studies and research in the United States. The Shida Scholarship Program is made possible by a generous donation from the family of the late Dr. Shida. [Recipients of Scholarship]

Scholarship recipients must meet the following criteria:

- Have a clearly defined research focus and share high aspirations to continue research at American, Canadian, or UK university or research institution to produce advanced results;
- Aspirations to play an active role in the international community at large, but especially in Japan and the U.S. in the field of their relevant research.
- Willing to contribute to the development of Kyoto University and Kyodai Collaborative while utilizing the network established locally and maintaining the relationship with Kyoto University and Kyodai Collaborative.

[Target Students · Tracks and Summary of the Scholarship Program]

There are three tracks of study abroad for students currently enrolled in or have graduated from **the Kyoto University Faculty of Engineering or Graduate School of Engineering**. Each track has a different program length, number of candidates, and award amount.

<Research Track>

① Doctoral candidates (for post-doctoral research)

This track is for those expected to finish a Ph.D. program in March of the following year, and who have the

intention of pursuing a post-doctoral fellowship at a university laboratory or research institution in North America and United Kingdom.

② Students currently enrolled in a doctoral degree program (for joint research)

This track is for those who are currently enrolled in a doctoral degree program of Kyoto University and who intend to pursue joint research at a university laboratory or research institution in North America or UK, and expected to go back to Kyoto University after joint-research program.

< Ph.D. Track >

③ Expected graduates of master's degree or bachelor's degree programs

This track is for those who are expected to graduate from a master's course or bachelor's course in March of the following year, and who intend to continue their research in the form of obtaining a doctoral degree at a university in North America or UK. Students who graduated from Kyoto University and have already started studying abroad and are currently continuing their research in North America/UK or those who already graduated from Kyoto University and are continuing their research at Kyoto University are also eligible.

[Study abroad period, number of scholars, amount of scholarship]

Note that the scholarship amount can be used for any living expenses, research expenses, tuition, and travel fees.

[Application Requirements]

The applicant must meet the following requirements:

- Be enrolled in or have graduated from Kyoto University's Faculty of Engineering OR Graduate School of Engineering at the time of their application.
- Be a Japanese citizen or a permanent resident of Japan.
- · Start their study abroad in the year of admission (for Ph.D. Track, the following year of admission) to the

scholarship program. Students who graduated from Kyoto University and have already started studying abroad and are currently continuing their research in North America or UK or those who already graduated from Kyoto University and are continuing their research at Kyoto University are also eligible. For Joint Research track, the applicant must be enrolled in Kyoto University's bachelor's degree or graduate degree at the time of application.

- · Intend to pursue research at a graduate school or an equivalent research institution in North America or UK.
- If applying for the Ph.D. track, applicants must plan to obtain a Ph.D. at a university in North America or UK.
- · Research/study must be related to an Engineering field.
- This scholarship can only be applied to private study abroad. If you are currently in or plan to apply to a government or company funded program, you may not be eligible for this scholarship. You should be reminded that receiving this scholarship may also exclude you from being awarded funding from those types of programs depending on their requirements or restrictions.

If a case where an applicant is awarded or expected to be awarded from another foundation or institution, at the time of the application, an applicant must notify the Shida Scholarship Program manager in writing (in the Application Form) with the details about additional sources of income or potential sources of income including:

- Names of institutions or scholarship programs you've applied to for additional funding.
- o The amount of scholarship/funding if known at the time of the application.

(Note that receiving other scholarships or funding is allowed under Shida Scholarship.)

- English language proficiency is an important component of the selection criteria, although we do not set a minimum score for TOEFL/IELTS, etc. While there is not a minimum standard for English language skill at the time of the application, accepted scholars are expected to acquire a certain level of English language proficiency before traveling to North America/UK to the extent that it will not interfere with your life, studies, or research immediately after arrival.
- There is no age limit.

[Other considerations]

If you are applying for this scholarship before your host university or research institution has been selected, please list your top four choices in priority order in the space provided on the Application Form.

Such information is considered as a reference during the first stage selection process.

- ① Application Form (Please use the form uploaded on the website.)
- ② Cover Letter and CV in English (A description of your background, achievements & awards, research projects and research results, etc. Free format.)
- ③ Recommendation Letter(From your advising professor, free format, 1-2 pages long.)
- ④ A document describing the details and importance of your research or a summary of your thesis. <u>They must be provided in English</u> if the original document is in Japanese. (In A4 paper, 2-3 pages long. Please describe your goal and career aspirations at the end of the document.)
- ⑤ Certificate of Graduation/Completion or Certificate of Expected Graduation/Completion (Not necessary for the Joint Research Track)
- 6 Academic Transcript (The most recent one.)
- Tertificate of Acceptance or Letter of Acceptance (includes email) from a university or a research institution if an applicant has already been accepted at the time of the application. For an applicant of Ph.D. Track, if you are selected to this Shida Scholarship, you must submit such document to Kyodai Collaborative as soon as you've chosen a university you would pursue for your Ph.D. degree.
- ® English language skill test (TOEFL/IELTS, etc.) score sheet. Copies are accepted, but it must be issued within 2 years from the deadline of this application.
